The mentioned service would support faster and more efficient actions of border guards at the local level to select/mark sensor/detector</li> </ul>	The scope of the BMVI Specific Action to "Support to Member States' national strategies for European integrated border management' (ref. no. BMVI/2022/SA/1.2.3), as per the call document, is: 'to provide support to Member States and SAC in the establishment of their national strategies for the implementation of EIBM, specifically with a view to the setting up or the enhancing of a national centralised governance function'. The focus is the cooperation and information exchange component of EIBM: proposals should aim at strengthening coordination between national authorities having competences in the management of external borders (see examples provided under section 3.3. of the call document). The purchase of the border surveillance equipment and services mentioned in the question does not fall within the scope of the call.

The setting up of a national IT tool aims at contributing to the implementation of the EIBM concept, i.e. a shared portal or platform, website falls under the scope of this call as long as it is encompassing the different areas of border management or contributing to the communication of different authorities with responsibilities at external borders.
<ol> <li>What purchases could be included in this point and are there any percentage limits on purchases?</li> <li>Is the project focused only on cooperation and activities based on meetings, seminars, etc, whether the Border Guard can focus on purchasing communication an IT equipment.</li> </ol>	<ol> <li>Costs incurred for setting up a national IT tool are eligible (e.g. IT devices and software licences, its maintenance and upgrade, etc.) and purchases shall be made in line with the applicable national and EU rules, within the available budget set for the project proposal.</li> <li>The proposal may include one or several activities, as per the examples on pages 5-6 of the call document, contributing to the objective, notably of setting up or the enhancing of a national centralised governance function for the implementation of EIBM.</li> </ol>
Is the posting of a liaison officer to Frontex eligible under this call?	The main objective of this specific action is setting up or enhancing a national centralised governance function, encompassing coordination among all relevant national authorities with competences in the

The tasks of this position will entail close cooperation with other national authorities participating in Frontex activities, in particular the defence, immigration and return authorities, who are responsible for implementing IBM functions. It will thus support and strengthen the development and implementation of EIBM at national level.	European Integrated Border Management (EIBM). The posting of a liaison officer to the Frontex headquarters would facilitate the communication between the national contact point and the Agency, but it has no direct effect on the inter-agency cooperation among the national authorities. Therefore, as such it is not considered eligible under this call.
	Proposals should aim at setting up or enhancing the national centralised governance function, by clearly focusing on improving the inter-agency cooperation among the national authorities in each Member State that are responsible for border control/other tasks carried out at the border.
